By direction of the President, in addition to the Distinguished Service Cross awarded to Captain Herann J. F. Bottchor, ess Infantry, by the Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Facific Area, as published on Page 1, Ceneral Orders Marber 64, 1942, Ceneral Headquarte a, Southwest Pacific Area, a bronze Oak-leaf Cluster is awarded to him by the Commanding General, United States Army Forces in the Far East, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 9 July 1918 (Bulletin Ho. 45, W. D., 1918). The citation is as follows:

Captain MERGAL J. P. 107776 F. (0030451) was Infantry, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in action near Suma, New Guinea, on 20 Possiber 1940. Although wounded the previous day, Captain Notteber volunteered to lead a detachment of infantry in an attack on an enemy strongpoint in terrain with which he was failiar. He carefully prepared the men for the attack, and then encouraged the by his own example to advance within twenty yards of the energy emplecaments. When the patrol was held up by small arms fire in this advanced position, in stood up without regard for his own safety and drew the enemy fire so that the patrol could move to another area. He was again wounded during this action. Captain Bottcher's cutstanding courage and leadership were an inspiration to the non under his command.
