WAR DIARY

Enemy Situation As of 16 November 1944: The lat Inf Div which landed at ONFOC on I and 2 November was the enemy force present in the Division some of action. The lat Inf Div was composed of the lat Inf Regt, 43th Inf Regt, the 57th Inf Regt, the lat FA Regt, the lat Transportation Regt, the lat Engineer Regt, the lat Rom Regt, and the lat Signal Init with a total estimated strength of approximately 12,000 mem.

As of 16 Nevember 1944, the 57th Inf Regt was deployed in the SEEAL NECK and CORESCREW RIGGS area, 2000 yes N of LINON. The 49th Inf Regt was located in the HILL 1525 area. The 1st Inf Regt was in the MT PIWA area and later moved to the LINON area. Elements of the 1st Engineer Regt were attached to the three infentry regiments. The CP of the 1st Jop Division was located just W of km mark No. 79 on HICHWAY 2 (06.1-61.0). The exact location on 16 November of the 1st Engineer Regt, the 1st Rem Regt, and the 1st Ramsportstion Regt is not known.

18 NOVEMBER:

2_8

At 1520001 25-30 Japs attacked 2nd 3n 21st Inf from the S. 12 Japa KIA. At 1534001 25-30 Japs attacked 3rd 3n, 21st Inf perimeter. 12 Japa KIA. Jap morter fire was received during the attacks. At 1512001 20 Japs were KIA by morter fire on road S of LIMON. At 1612001 a group of 15 and one of 30 Japs were observed dug-in vicinity of COLACIAN. At 1612001 a Japa 75 mm gun was observed firing from vicinity 2nd 3n, 19th Inf perimeter. Japs reported mixing road 8 of LATTS RIVER Bridge. 44 Japa KIA.

G-3

The 128th Inf, with guides furnished by 21st Inf, passed through front lines held by 21st Inf and begges their drive 5. The 127th Inf moved to assembly area between CAPOCCAN and PINEMPOAN, and the 126th Inf remained as Division reserve in vicinity of TUNGA. Div Hq for the period was located at COLASIAN. OF closed at 1614001. FO 3, Hq 52d Inf Biv, was issued. Forward claments 128th Inf departed from assembly area at 08001, moving into ferest assembly area immediately in rear of 21st Inf positions. A Go. 128th Inf jumped off at 12001 from L/D (06.7-66.7) to [06.8-66.7).

17 NOMERER:

C-2

As enemy force of approximately 200 men complete the strong position in the high ground 100 yards HE of LIMON. Other enemy troops are falling back to the S to the vicinity of LIMON, and memorous troops have been observed moving in and out of LIMON. The enemy's defensive positions are

well prepared; they are dug into caves and well concealed individual fox-holes.

Dog tags from Jap dead in the vicinity of LIMON -- PINAMOPOAN identified the 3rd Infantry gun company of the 57th Inf Regt.

Several rounds of enemy 75mm artillary fire were received in the OP areas of the 52d Div and the 187th Inf Rest between 1550 and 1700 today, emsing slight damage and minor injury.

An enemy truck column was observed from the air to be moving to the H of CAMANCA. A patrol from the 1st Hn, 34th Inf reported observing 200-300 Japs in well-dug positions S of BOMBORGOM. 87 enemy KIA. No PWs.

G-3

lat Bn, 128th Inf, eccupying position (06.6-66.8) (07,1-66.7) map, LEYTH ISLAND 1:50,000 forced the enemy's right flank to withdress. Enemy fire during the period, from dug-in and concealed positious, was consistent. The 3rd Bn advancing toward LIMCH received scattered fire on approaching the village. The 127th Inf relieved elements of the 19th and 21st Infs, while the 126th Inf remained in assembly area NV of JARO. Period was cloudy with intermittent rains and only fair visibility. Our easualties, 8 EIA and 37 WIA.

18 MOVEMBERS;

G-2

The enemy still occupies the high ground 1000 yds NE of LIMCH and has constructed numerous pillbexes in that area. Dug-in enemy positions have been located on the bluffs on both sides of Route #2, 1000 yards 8 of LIMCH. Considerable Jap vehicular activity commission Route #2. The Japs have constructed a road block on HICHMAY #2 at TOLIBAN. Light tanks and armored cars were observed moving N and 8 on HICHMAY #2, 8 of TOLIBAN during the night. Our troops on the 8 and 8 flank of the hill feature 1 mile SS of LIMCH received heavy fire from numerous pillboxes. Jap artillery fired on our OPs located at PINAMOPOAN and 1 mile SM of CULASIAN, and damaged 3 of our artillery pieces near PINAMOPOAN. Several rounds fell in the Div CP area between 1200 and 1300 cassing some casualties.

8-8

In bright clear weather, with excellent visibility, the 128th Inf emgaged the enemy with bayonets and hand gremades after laying a mortar barrage. 3rd Rn, 128th Inf advanced toward LIMON, while our crtillery obliterated enemy MC positions. The 127th Inf protected lines of communications along the LIMON Highway to PINAMOPOAN still without enemy contact, while the 136th Inf remained at JARC. The 3rd Bn, 128th Inf Separted for a new assembly area E of PINAMOPOAN. Casualties for the period were 15 EIA, 54 WIA and 1 HIA.

8-E-C-R-E-T

19 NOVEMBER:

G-2

The enemy is still holding their position 1000 yeards NE of LIMON. Small groups of Japa have infiltrated and harassed our troops and lines of communications on the road between PINAMOPOAN and CAPCOCAN and in the CP ereas. The energy has meds frequent attacks with mortar support since 05001 this morning against our troops along MIGHMAY \$2, 1000 yds se of TOBILAN. At 14801, a fin of Japa were moving WE across the high ground E of the road, 1500 yes S of TOLIBAN. The solumn was dispersed by our artillary fire. The enemy was driven from the ridge 1000 yes us of LIMON, but the enery strong point 200 yes SE of this ridge is still holding with EMGs in pillboxes supported by 4 or 5 IMGs. Civilians reported that Japs are digging in 1500 yds SW of DOMIRI. During the night a liaison party was stracked by 15 Japs 600 yds B of PINAMOPOAN and the party was forced to withdraw. An enemy MO thought to be on the M slope of HILL 1526 fired on our barges unloading at PINAMOPOAN. A Jap PW septured 1000 yes SE of PINAMOPOAN identified the 6th Co of the 49th Inf Regt. He stated that the remainder of the 2nd Bu of the 49th Inf was immediately 8 of his com-Pery.

0-3

186th Inf, in contact with the enemy, killed several Jap patrol members. 3d Bn, 126th Inf after moving from JARO encountered resistance while recommoitering their bivanes area. Accumulated casualties were 30 KIA, 188 WIA and 3 MIA, mimus casualty report from 128th Inf for the period, also 32d off and 114th sage bn. 188th Inf completed plans for an early attack on 20 Dec 44 to draighten their lines. Two companies of the 128th Inf moved in to destroy enemy opposition on eastern ridge of the two ridges that comprise CORKSCREW RIDGE and were involved in a heavy fight for the ridge. 3d Bn, 188th Inf, sent a strong party N to reinforce the two companies on western ridge of the two ridges that comprime CORESCREW RIDGE. I Corps authorized Air Corps to strike at enemy tanks and trucks parked on HICHMAY 2. Patrols from 8d Bn, 187th Inf moved forward to destroy Jap WOs firing on LOME coming into PINASOPOAN. Mortan fire was delivered from 0780I to 0950I, preparatory to attack on Jap positions facing A Co and C Co, 187th Inf. Heavy artillery fire was effected by our units in the drive to LIMCH. 127th Inf. unable to move its of forward because of traffic, planned to move forward in the morning. Blow ants of let and 2d Bus, 187th Inf. patrolled their respective grans.

SO NOVERBER!

G-2

The bulk of the enemy forces are now located to the S of the LIMCE force. Some perties of Japs, 6-8 mem each have infiltrated through the hills to the NE and are heressing communication lines, artillery positions, and OPs along the coast as far N as CAPOCAN. Delayed report from let ha, 36th inf states that over 200 Japs were killed in the 19 November attack 1000 yds N of Telisam. This attack was repulsed by an estimated by Japs using EMGs, 90mm mortars and knee morter fire. Our forces attacked

the Jap strong point 1000 yds NE of LIMON; 27 Japs were KIA and 2 BMGs and 4 LMGs were captured. 2 Bms of the 126th Inf, upon reaching HILL 1525 received rifle and knee morter fire from an estimated Co of Japs, to the 3 and 5E. A reliable civilian reported an estimated Jap Bm located on 3 high peaks near HILL 1525. An estimated Jap Co infiltrated through our lines demolishing vehicles and installations and established a position astride the road at the bridge midway between CULASIAN and PINAMOPOAN.

Jsp artillery fire was received 2000 yda SE of CULASIAN and MGs 500 yda S of this point were firing on our LVTs in CARICARA BAY.

Documents taken 500 yds S of DUMIRI indentify the 9th Co of the 57th Inf Regt. The 1st and 3rd Bus of the of the 57th Inf Regt have been identified in the LIMON area. An estimated 50-60 Japs engaged our forces in a fire fight 100 yds S of the bridge at ANTIPOLO. 23 Japs KIA in this action.

0-3

FO No. 4, this Eq. directed 126th Inf to attack SW in the Div some of action and continue toward LINGW. The 127th Inf continued its defense of the right flank of the division. The 128th Inf continued its bitter hand to hand action in the CONESCREW RIDGE area begun the preceding day. The 127th Inf protected communications on highway from LINGW to PINAMOPAGN. The 126th Inf secured the high ground NW of HILL 1525, overcoming ineffectual Jap resistance. Continuous artillery support was effective, especially in the case of the 34th Inf. The enemy persisted in infiltration methods to silence our artillery; all attempts failed. For the period there were 560 enemy KIA, 1 PW. Our casualties totaled 4 KIA, 41 WIA and 2 MIA.

21 NOVEMBER:

3-2

The enemy forces S of LIVON have been reinforced and are strongly opposing our troops attacking to the S in the KALOGRACAN area. An estimated well-equipped Go of Japs are dug in on the high ground 800 yds ME KALOGRACAN. An estimated 500 Japs were moving Wf rom this area toward our positions. 25-30 Japs remained in the area 1 mile NS of LIMON.

2 PWs captured 1000 yds EW of PINAMOPOAN identify the 5th Co of the 57th Inf Hegt.

At 1010I a column of an estimated 500 Japs, pulling 7 artillery pieces by hand, were observed moving 8 on NIGHMAY #2 approximately 1500 yes to 8 of LIMON. Artillery fire made direct hits on this column; our troops were in contact with elements of this column 1000 yes 8 of LIMON. Well-placed MG fire from 3 positions in the area just 8 of PINAMOPOAN harassed our LVT and barge traffic. An estimated group of 50 Japs, some wearing American elething and equipment, were dig-in 200 yes 8 of the beach at CULASIAN and were placing morter, LMG and MMG fire on our troops. An estimated 60 Japs were digging in on the W side of the creek, 1 hile 35%

of ANTIPOLO.

Guerrillas told the 32d Ron Troop that the Japs have two roads E of HIGHWAY #2, one 2 miles ME and the other 1 mile ME of LUPERIL. Total enemy casualties to date: 850. Total PWs to date: 4.

Captured PW states the 2nd 3n of the 57th Inf Regt is quite depleted in strength. The 5th Co of this Regt was reduced from a strength of 140 to 11. PW further stated that approximately 15 15cm Hows have been placed in position immediately S of LINCE. He reported rations as being low and assumition plentiful. Documents identified elements of the 41st Inf Regt 1 mile WSW of PINAMOPOAN and elements of the 49th Inf Regt 2 mile NW of ARTIPOLO.

0-5

In a period of light rains, with varying degrees of visibility, the attack continued. The 128th Lai continued its fierce hand-te-hand encounter with the enemy. The 127th Inf continued its protestion of the LIMON-FINANCEPOAN Highway, easisted by the 632d TD Bn. One Bn of the 125th Inf destroyed a Jap force that had attempted a penetration of the highway. The 126th Inf consolidated in positions near HILL 1525. The 34th Inf met continued enemy resistance. Our artillary continued pounding enemy positions. There were 200 enemy KIA for the period as compared to 11 of our own, with 26 WIA and 3 MIA.

G = 1

Generally speaking, the morale of the Division and attached units, during the period was excellent. However, it was hampered by continuous adverse weather conditions and mimerous moves. Upon arrival in this operational area, sufficient time was not available to the Division to assemble and move all unit and personal equipment from beach areas to unit ereas prior to commitment into action. Fresh meat, eggs, butter and bread were issued during the period. Arrangements are being made for fresh turkey to all troops on Thanksgiving Day. 77 pouches of 1st Class mail were received for Division units.

The administration of civillan population, in the Division area, was assumed by this command.

ER NOVEMBER:

J+2

The bulk of the enemy forces are still along RICHWAY #2 in the area a of LINCH. The lat Bn of the 34th Inf in the KALOGRATAN area, W of CICHWAY #2, was attacked by a reinforced Co from the E and attacked twice by an estimated Jap Bn from the S. One or two enemy bns are now S of the bridge which is 1000 yes S of LINCH. Small Jap parties still remain in the area approximately 1500 yes SE of PINAMOPOAN. The enemy force which was at the beach NW of CULASIAN attempted to retreat to the S, and 50 Japs of this force were killed by our troops. There is an estimated Jap Go at SINATAWAN. Querrillas report 600 Japs at TACCOJ and 400 Japs at the road junction 32 miles SEW of CANANGA. They further state that there are 3000-10,000 Japs in an area approximately 4 miles long and 3 miles wide extending to the N with CANANGA as the SW corner. It was reported that all Jap troops in the CRECC-PALONFON area are moving N.

G-3

The Division planned to secure the high ground near SINAYAWAS and destroy the enemy in the area. The 128th Inf penetrated the pocket of enemy resistance near LINON while the 127th Inf destroyed remarks of the enemy force which had penetrated the PINAMOPOAN road. In the face of herassing enemy fire, the 126th Inf consolidated their positions near HILL 1525. The lat im, 54th Inf successfully repelled a sudden enemy attack on HILAY ridge. Our field artillery was still the target for enemy action, and while continuing their effective firing, repelled repeated minor attacks. Casualties for the period were relatively light.

3-2

28 NOVEMBER

Enersy forces continue to eccupy the ridges to the S and SE of LIMOS with pockets of resistance remaining in the area 2000 yes E of LIMON. An estimated reinforced Bn is located along the road 500 years of TOLIBAN. This force is being supplied by trucks at night. To the E of "IGHTAY #2 there are 3 poskets of 30-40 Japs on the high ground 1 mile SE of LIMON. At 1300I in an area 1 mile 8 of PINAMOPOAN on enemy force of 200 with 2 75mm guns established a trail block and engaged our forces in a fire fight. Approximately 60 Japs with a RIG, occupy the high ground 3000 yes SE of LIMON Approximately 130 Japa were killed in the area between PINAMITINAN and CULASIAN. The remaining Japs retreated to the 5% to join an estimated Bn occupying the high ground 200 yds W of SIVAYAMAN. So Japa were killed in the CHASIAN-PINAMOPOAN area. Patrols reported a Jap bivouse area on the ridge MR of LONOY. The enemy blew up the bridge across the TAGBONG RIVER. The bridge 1000 yes HR of CANANGA is heavily guarded. Three artillarypieces were located on a hill 300 yds to the E of CANANGA. Civilians report 8000 poorly equipped Japs in the vicinity of RIZAL 2500 yds N of LIBOTCAO. Approximately 3D rounds of Jap setillery fire were received during the day in the vicinity of the Division CP at CAPOOCAN. Two Jap planes attacked our supply dump at PINAMOPOAN but caused no demage. A patrol found a dead Filipino who had been tied to a tree and bayonsted.

9-3

Daring the 2d and 3d Bms, 188th Inf's attack through LINCX Village, an estimated 30-40 Japs KIA. The 2d Bm attacked on the west of TIGHMAY #2. The advance emecuntered minor opposition and all units crossed the river where strong opposition was met as the left front. One company of the whore strong opposition was met as the left front. One company of the 186th Inf left PIRAMITINAN, advanced 200 yards and met light resistance which they knocked out with morter fire. Enemy withdraw and our troops which they knocked out with morter fire. Enemy withdraw and our troops occupied higher ground. The read from Capoccan to PIRAMOPORN is open, with our engineers repairing the damaged areas. The 127th Inf moved E of the 2d Bm, 128th Inf', reporting 2 tanks and 30 Japs, which our artillery engaged.

M MOVEMBER:

0 - 2

Enemy troops occupy the ridge 500 yds E of BOWBONGON. A strong pocket of enemy redictance I mile NE of LIMCH was rediced by our troops and 163 Japs were KIA. An estimated 30 Japs attacked elements of the Sath Inc I mile NW of SINAYAMAN during the night and 16 Japs were killed. At 10001 an estimated 60 Japs attacked this position from the N and were repulsed. Minemy artillery fire continues to harass our lines of communication and artillery positions. Two Jap Rem planes were shot down by AA over CAPOOCAN. Captured PW identified the 3rd Bm of the 49th Inf Regt in the corridor E of LIMCH.

3-3

Scattered rifle fire was received in Div arty areas causing several

easialties. All road blooks were removed. Artillery fire broke up an enemy solumn and scattered horses and saimsons proceeding toward LIMCS. Enemy continued to regist the savence of the 128th laf by means of satematic weapons in pillboxes. Patrels were sent out to contact Sath Inf. The 3d Bu, 188th Inf attacked S along the W sie of HIGHWAY 2. Combat efficiency, was reported excellent. Enemy on ridge 500 yds E of BONBONGOE. Strong pocket one mile ME of LIMCH reduced.

25 NOVEMBER

0-2

Snowy troops still ecoupy the ridge 600 yes E of BORBONOCK. An estimated 2 dos of Jeps are legated 600 yds 52 of LIMON. Secany strong points are still located to N and B of LIERN Small groups of Japa are still in the vicinity of Hill 1888. Documents captured in the KALOGRACAN eres indicate the presence of the 2nd Bn of the let Inf Regt in the area es of 15 Hev. Patrols located as estimated Jap Co dug-in on the ridge 500 yds E of HALOGRAGAE. Our artillery fired on a group of 60 Jeps 1000 yds HE of RALOGRACAH cousing heavy casualties. 1000 yds 8 of PINEMOPOAK, an unestimated number of Japa attacked our forces and 30 enemy were killed. The 32d Rem Troop reported the CANANGA-PALGERON road clear of Jops to within Mon of Palourom. The road is in good condition but some of the bridges are demaged. At 1900I approximately 82 rounds of Jap areillery fire were received in the CULASIAN eres, several rounds falling near the Division CP. The let and 2nd Sn of the 126th Inf were shelled during the night. An operational order for the 2nd Bn of the 1st Inf Rogt was eaptured at the southern edge of the perimeter of the lat Ba, 34th Inf.

6-8

Aggressive patrol action in the division area located end destroyed minor areas of resistance. The 128th Inf from its same positions H of LIME, resisted a suction enemy attack. The 126th Inf enturied enemy parties carrying supplies. The Seth Inf destroyed a number of the enemy in a night attack. The duel between our artillery and that of the enemy continued, with our artillery delivering direct hits on enemy vehicles and field pieces. Enemy camaities showed a merked increases 434 KIA to 21 of our own men.

BE HOVE CHER!

In the KALOGBACAN erea, the 1st Bu of the 34th Inf is still in contest with Jap forces of unestimated strength to the E. S. and W of their positions with a strong Jep patrel of 30-40 mm astride their supply trail 100 yes of KALGERADAE. Our tanks destroyed 2 Jep artillery places, hit as sessuition them and killed is Japs. A strong pocket of resistance I mile HE of LIMCH was eliminated at 16001 wish an estimated 92 Japa ElA. A party of 15 Japs were engaged on a supply trail on the W slope of HILL 1525. A strong enemy position 200 yds W of SINATAWAS was climinatedem estimated 75 Japa were killed. 32d Hom Troop reports 200/300 Japa in the escenarit grove to the SW of the road junction 3 miles 8 of CANAMOA. Querrillas reported patrols of 15/80 Japs on the ridges W of HISHMAY #8

between CANANGA and LONOY. A civilian reported 700 Japs bivoused along the road 1800 yes W of MT CATABARAN. Approximately 460 remade of energy spitilery were received in our artillery positions during the period. A FW stated that the lat and 2d Bas of the 49th Inf Regt had been consolidated into one in with a strength of 350 Em for the consolidated in as of 180 Nov. Total Japs killed to date: 2184. Total PWs to date: 8.

0.3

Enemy resistance remaining in the 183th Inf some of action was destroyed. Other units regrouped, secured supplies and prepared for the drive a. Host sectors were quiet at the close of the period; enemy setivity increasing 8 of LIMON only. The 186th Inf extended their lines 8 and 30 despite miser first fights. Supplies were unloaded and beach affects as the secure approach by the 54th Inf. Our artillery secured hits on enemy trucks and bivouse areas with excellent results, and in some sectors delivered herassing fire throughout the night.

27 BOYRER:

(A-42)

A reinforced rifle to is opposing our forces approximately 800 yds H of TOLIBAN. An estimated I companies of Japs evanuated their positions 1000 yds WE of TOLIBAN during the night. Mortar fire was placed on an estimated 80 Japs occupying a small knoll 1 mile H of LIMCS. A lieison pilet observed a Jap OF 12 miles H of EALOGRAGH. Our forces were in contact with an estimated 150 Japs on the W slope of HILL 1825. A captured diery revealed that the strength of the Jap consolidated Bu of the 49th Inf Regt has severely depreciated. A guarrilla reported that the enemy has been receiving daily reinforcements at PALOMPON by barge from 1500. A 32d Rom Troop officer observed 250 Japs Leading at PALOMPON from barges. Enemy artillery positions have been located 800 yds Ne of SONBORSON, 1600 yds H of EALOGRAGH, and one mile ME of LUPERIA. Dog tags indicated the presence of the 171st End Inf Ym.

0-3

The Division prepared for an attack towards the SH, with all units resdied for an enemy counterattack reported forthcoming. The 186th Inf extended its lines, patrolled aggressively, as did the 56th Inf. Our field artillery continued to hardes the enemy, quantities were light for the period.

SE MOVIMBER:

Ø-2

A patrol reports that there are Japa dug-in in caves 1 ha SW of LIMON. 180 Japa were killed by our forces moving 8 on the 2 side of HICE-WAY just 8 of LIMON. A strong pocket of resistance 2000 yes 8 of LIMON was amililated at 18001 and 36 Japa were killed. 30 Japa were killed by our forces on the W slope of HILL 1836 with an estimated 40 days still effecting resistance in this area. 65 Japa were killed by our forces edvencing 8 2000 yes 8W of SINATAWAN. Civilians report 5000 days in the vicinity of RIZAL, LIBONGAO, and HAMANAGAN which are small berrios 8 of CANANGA. An examilation deep is located in the school house at CANANGA. Shows artillery was active on our forward positions and Cyc during the day.

The Division moved SW of LIECH, oversoming stiffening casesy resistance. A small erms attack on the 128th Inf was repulsed; the 187th patrolled vigorously for any continued enemy, while the 126th Imf attacked and secured enemy positions. Artillery shelling by the enemy continued—ours replied, with effective results on enemy troops. A total of 2525 enemy have been KIA to date with 8 PWs. Our casualties include 186 KIA, 687 WIA and 15 MIA.

One officer and 12 enlisted men were interred in USAF Casatary. CANIGARA. 127 personnel were interred to date in USAF Casatary PINAMOPOAN We l. One NM replacement was received for the Division during the period.

Morale generally was excellent. Turkeys were distributed to all units with kitchen facilities. Belonce was stored in refrigerators for the remaining troops. Cigarette ration was distributed. There is a need for personal toilet articles. Arrangements were made with I dorps for distribution of their daily newspaper to the Division. Award of 7 Bromse Ster medals and 1 Oak Leaf Cluster to a Bromse Ster medal was amounced.

Morale was impaired on essasions by numerous every shellings of Division and Unit Hos and bivouse areas. Adverse weather, tressportation difficulties, and inadequate bathing facilities, materially effected morals. 35 pouches of mail were received.

A problem was obtaining civilian labor for supply trains, damp areas and evacuation of casualties, due to enony artillary and supper fire.

Our forces encountered six light tanks on HIGHWAY #2 800 yes 6E of TOLIBAN. Four tanks were used as a road block and the other two were used to withdraw supplies or guns to the S of the tank screen. They fired MG and 37mm at our positions but were repulsed. The main enemy position resisting our attacks are on both sides of the road. Several rounds of departillery fire were again directed at the LEYTE RIVER bridge but no demage resulted. An enemy battery located by gun flashes approximately 8000 yes 8 of the LEYER RIVER bridge was silemosed by counter-battery fire. Our forces, astride the road, encountered several organized groups in pockets of resistance, some with 50 Japs and 5 Mids. Granade and morter fire were also received by our troops. Bright weather introduced a period of increased novement. The attack was pushed by the assault bettaliens, with the strongest opposition countering the movement of the 126th Inf. In a bid for a break-through the enemy harled 6 tanks at our line. This attack was repulsed by evening end the battered tanks withdress. The 128th Inf, continued its consolidation of the area E, H, and 8 of LIMCS and held the XILAY RIDGE approach. The 127th Inf, SN of TOLIBAN encountering determined opposition, advanced 600 yds 5. The 128th Inf, SE of TOLIBAN, repulsed the tank attack, and after a bitter first fight, advanced to higher ground. Encay killed during the period totaled 143, with 2 PMs. 21 of our men were killed and 67 wounded.

14 DECISIONS

G = 2

Recent troops continued their determined resistance on both sides of STO WAY \$6, being in highly favorable terrain and employing numerous automatic weapons. Identities of various units indicated the enexy was employing every available element to delay our advance. A Rea Troop patrol located 8 artillary pieces in wall dug in and concealed positions 100 yds SE of LONGY. This sea was covered by counter-battery fire. Sammy artillary remained silent during this period, but immediately after 18001 it shelled the LIMCH bridge area for an hour. They appeared to have some from a single gan and were speeced at \$1 to 8 minute intervals. 50 Them rounds fell but were 800-600 yards off the target.

A Jap demolition unit of 29-30, completely comouflaged and using phosperous on their helmets, attacked the 120th Inf CP. They were completely samihilated by CP personnel. This special unit carried demolition kits, granades, detenators, 286 and 90 mm morter. Documents identified it as a Ist Inf Regt unit. Our troops on the E of Route 2 received 37mm high explosive fire from a light tank, which they destroyed by bascoks fire. Buring the night of 18/14 Dec the following enemy tank activity was observed 500 yes SE of TOLIBAR on Route 2; 5 tanks moving N and 6 moving 2. Three of these tanks were destroyed by our basooks fire. A patrol destroyed & MNs and a LMB. Our I & R Plateon contacted 35 Japa, paratrospers, armed with . 30 Cal rifles, grounde dischargers and at least one LMG. Energ was pinned down by our suiper fire. Four Jap tanks were observed N of CAMBOA by artillery lisison pilets. Artillery fire was placed on them. Several supply and assumition desps were destroyed by our artillery. Artillery fire was also placed on large enemy troop concentrations in the vicinity of Children. Clear during entire period. No rais. The first completely dry day since 15 Nov.

3-3

Co "C", 127th Inf attacked from their position to the E, and made physical content with the 126th Inf. The 127th Inf continued the attack 8 with their last flank on the read with no enemy contents. A ration train to a sh of the 128th Inf was attacked by a party of Japs who were finally killed. Patrols killed several Japs, mostly wall-fed and carrying rations. 18 DECEMBER:

Enemy positions, ususually well dug-in and with exceedingly large pushers of suits on creeks of recor-back ridges which are heavily wooded. are opposing our forces in the area 1000 yes & of TOLIBAN. Snowy artillery was active, shelling our CPs, front line positions and placing 20-30 rounds in the LETTE RIVER bridge area. The enemy has memorous small supply sud grant tions duspo, well dug in, which enable their forces to maintain strong apposition. Japs have used tanks for supply purposes, 8 of which have been destroyed in the past 2 days. Enemy strong points can be eliminated only with flows throwers, grandes and hand-to-hand combat, up a temp, alippery, muchy terrain. Six Jep light tanks moving S along Route 2 were engaged with besooks and 5 were destroyed. Two Jep 75mm game, wall comouflased, were destroyed by our morter fire. One 105mm howitser, complete with crew, was overrun by our troops. Our was destroyed, orew killed. S made and 2 latts wiped out. A booky trep consisting of a bottle of Salti, attached to 50 lbs of emplosive, was discovered. 586 Ren Troop reported our artillery fire on Jap bivouse area near CAMANGA on night of 14/18 Dec very effective. The energy 's strong position 200 yds SE of TGLISAN was taken and 200 daps were killed, 500 yds S of their previous position, Jap forces are estimated as two companies. An extensively homey-combed system of caves, firing bays, eight-feet-deep forholes and deg-outs, covered every feet of the ground which constituted the enemy position eliminated at 10001. This area contained large amounts of personal equipment and clothing, two medical aid establishments and a large amount of decements, and was believed to have been a He installation. Ins new Jap defensive line has its customary terrain advantage and well concealed MGs. One of our tanks was the recipient of three Moletov decitails, thrown by Japs from hidden fembles along the read. The Japs were killed and the tank was undamaged. American troops in the H sutakirts of GAMANIA were mosting light resistance from R IMCs. Some Jap kouse-to-house resistance was encountered in LONOY, but was climinated, and two 195mm artillary pieces were captured. Our Ron Troop patrol reported that small groups of Japs were moving W on TAGRONG ROAD, and that our artillary sot fire to a gas dump at TAGRONG. Querrillar report a total of 2850 Japs in PALORGO.

A PW revealed that the 1st Div Transportation R, gt got 1000 herses and 50 trucks ashers and knew of six 75mm guns, 7000 yds 8 of LIMCF, being destroyed. Weather clear during period. Japs killed to date: 5715. PWs to date: 50.

The 137th Inf spearheaded the scuthward attack of the Division. Encay remains opposed our advance 3 on HICMAY #2, strong evidence showing that our constant destruction of their positions has limited them to delaying action. The 138th Enf reported no encay contacts for the period as it centimed preparations for its most offensive. The 137th left in its shapes contacted two Jap companies, and the 126th Inf. after destroying a remaining Jap position in the vicinity of (06.2-61.3), is now disangaged from the encay. Encay casualties were 266, with one Ps. Horse of our men were killed sud only 12 wounded.

The new Jap defensive position, 2150 yds SE of TOLIBAW, continued its tensoious and stubborn resistance. All efforts to outflank these positions have received fire from sutcessic weapons so placed that our troops have received enfilede and grazing fire. To the NE, 400 out of 500 enemy troops in the vicinity of NT BUCHACH, are reported moving to the 3 and K. The present Jap defensive positions are located on no ridges approximately 3 miles NNE of LONOY. The ridges are compred with dense rain forests and are held by two enemy companies. During our flanking operations, 50 Japs were killed and 5 MGs explured. Our tanks eliminated a Jap road block, consisting of disabled Jap tanks, on the highway, approximately 3000 yds 8 of TULIBAW. Filiping Army units reported 1400 to 1500 Japs marching scutaward through CAMPOPO area. PW estimated strength of 57th Inf Regt at 750, 48th Regt at 500 and PW's unit of let Div had been annihilated as of 6 Dae. PW located the let Div CP at MT CATABARAN on 1 Dec. Weather: overest but changed to elem.

The southerly attack of the Division continued, the 127th Inf advancing through stubborn resistance. Our patrols, ranging from the lower reaches of the DACA RIVER to BEHACH reported no activity. The 128th Inf combed its sector theroughly with no results, while the 127th Inf continued its assault of enemy positions on the high ground E of RICHMAY #2. The 126th Inf continued extensive patrol operations H, BY and B of KILAY RIDGE. There were no enemy discovered. In preparation for the forthcoming 127th Inf advance, our artillery laid down a heavy preparatory fire on numerous moving targets and dispersed enemy concentrations. Morthbound groups of Japa were still being observed. Over 100 dead Japa were equated in the groupf the last Jap strong point. 15 MHz were captured in this position. Our tenks, advancing 8 on HIGHMAY \$2, 3000 year \$38 of TOLINAW, destroyed enother three Jap tanks, used as a road block. The Japa had mined the road is this area with 105mm projectiles with the fuses pointing upward. Our tasks destroyed 8 Jap tankettes 900 years of the reduced Jap road block. A total of seven 20 ton trucks, 2 armored ears (tracylaying type), 4 light tanks, 5 tankettes, two 105mm howithers and 15 Jap radios littered the road. The Division overse enemy positions after the jump-off this morning, with the 127th Inf smashing ferward to oust the enemy from their heavily defended positions near the bridge on HIGHWAY #2 N of LOMOY. Scattered equipment bore evidence of their hasty flight. Extensive searching of the rear areas produced only a few scattered stragglers. The 126th Inf established security patrols while the 127th Inf was plunging through the shattered Jap line, leaving two enemy rifle companies before them. The 126th Inf continued its patrolling of the rear area. Our artillary pounded Jap patrols until the proximity of our troops caused suspension of fire. Enemy killed totalled 248. Two of our man were killed gid 9 wounded.

23 DECEMBER:

Only isolated, Japs were contacted in the Division sector. Our patrol to the MT BUCHACH - WAMBIGAO area verified previous report of 400 Japs digging-in. 200 Japs were observed marching 5 from BUCHACH to TAGATAY. 600 to 600 Japs were reported just W of BURABHD. Civilians reported 2000 Japs moving W from VILLABA. A FW a tated that 500-600 Japs composing the remaints of the lat, 49th and 57th Inf Regt; Div Mg and lat Mngr Regt, retreated 5 from a point approximately 200 yds 3% of TULIAW. Another PW sated there were 2000 Jap patients in a hospital near VALENCIA on 16 Dec. PW revealed that out of 10 wounded, 2 return to combat, four die and the remaining are evecuated. Over 500 lbs of deciments were captured in the lat Div CP area. Showers totalling .05" during period.

3-3

After its sudden smeeting of the Jap line, the Division quickly reorganized preparatory to pressing their edventage and advancing to the W. The cone of action was patrolled and recommittered for terrain information that could be best used against the retreating enemy. Patrols reported only

faint traces of enemy usage of paths and trails. The 125th inf patrols with guerrilla aid located a good trail through rain forest W of ISE APCPO. Scattered contacts only are reported in the Division sector during the advance to the W. There is considerable Japanivity in the valley 1500 yes SW of MT BUGHACH, and it is possible the Japanese be reinforcing their defensive line from HILL 510 SE to MT CALTWOS. Our Ron Trees reported 250 Japaneved from CAMPCFO BAT to TIBATLA and moved SE on 23 Dec. In the valley NS of LIGAY, a Bu of Japanere observed in bivouse. These Japanere from TIBATLA near the W coast. Weather clear but changed to overeast with showers.

3-3

The Division commenced its advance W at 03001 through tangled rain forests and a succession of rugged hills. Only scattered parties of Japs remained to fight and were finally disposed of by our patrols. The 128th Inf. advancing in the northern sector of the Division zone of action, two Ens abreast encountered meager opposition. The 127th Inf. in like formation, and advancing W in the southern sector of the Division zone of action killed only a small enemy party. Patrols of the 126th Inf reported Japs were "travelling light" and quickly to the W. Lines of communication and the rear areas remained secure, and the rapid forward movement of all patrols decreased action of our artillery. Forty-three aneay were killed; only one of our man.

Our forces moving to the W had no enemy contact. Scattered sightings who every movements are to the W. A delayed report from the 127th Infindicated that 400 to 500 Japs armed with HMF and IMFs, were encountered at an undisclosed point during the 127th Inf's advance to the W on 25 Dec. These Japs were moving W and artillery fire killed 53. A Jap corabae pack train observed moving W 2000 yes 3 of BUSHACH. Artillery fire dispersed this train with unknown essualties. A supply dump of 75, 100mm assemution and gesolins were destroyed by our planes strafing CATORPOK 25 Dec.

No contacts of any consequence occurred during the day and enemy information points to the Jap retreat to the W. The 127th Inf reported a Jap OP 1000 yds 5% of BUGHACK, disposition unreported. Same Regt reported a heavily used trail and that 200-300 Japs had moved over it going W a short time previously. One Jap killed on the trail was from the 10th Co. 1st Inf Regt. Patrols from the Rem Troop encountered only a few Japs in CAMPONPON area. A PW captured at MAMBIJAC, 26 Dec. from the Trans Regt, 2d Co. 26th Div. stated that 1000 Jap troops started the retreat to the W on 16 Dec. 28 DECEMBER:

Only scattered stregglers were encountered by our Regts moving to the W. Civilian source stated 500 Japa were in TABANGO BAY area. 200 of which recently arrived from SAN ISIDEO. 128th Inf I & R Plateon operating 8000 yes a ci CARPOPO BAY estimates these Japa as 200. Weather was rainy and rainfall tetailed 1".

Advance elements of the Division reported no enemy contacts. The lat battalions of each of the two regiments led the forward movement in their respective regimental sector. Supplies and rations were dropped to our forward parties. Fragmentary reports indicated that one recommissioned group had reached the W coast of LEYTE in the vicinity of TARANGO BAY. - 4. The condition of the roads throughout this period varied from "poor" to "fair". The S2d Div road responsibility was from he mark 59.5 to the front lines for the first 3 days. This section of the read was closed to all traffic, between the hours of 10001 and 16001. Between 16001 and 10001 it was onen to 3/4 for vehicles or smaller. Emergency repairs were being made constantly. On 19 Dec the 114th Engre devoted their entire affort to healing gravel for road regairs. Other than a small pocket, which was eliminated, in the CAMPONPON area, no encey strength was encountered in the drive to the W coast, SCO Japa were observed moving to vicinity of FORFUNA. Same source (I & F Platom, 128th Inf) reported 96th Guerrilla Regt OP was attacked by an unknown number of Japa in U.S. uniforms. "A" Co of the 128th Inf occupied CAMPONICA, killing SI Japa. Information from 96th Querrilla Regt stated 400 Jaya were in the area of MASISI, AREVALE, TABANGO and OTABON. A group of 20 Japa approached our Rom Troop CP but were Marivem off by rifle fire. One Japa mandered into this CP with one of our surrender leaflets. Major elements of the 2d Dm. 187th Inf Regt contacted the Jups, who had attacked our Ron Troop CF on 31 Dec. at a point 1500 yms 8 of BARAMBANG. This Jap force used 8 MMGs. 8 IMGs and an unaknown number of morters. This force was defeated with a total of Yl Japs killed and 5 MGs captured. Clear weather with no rain during period.

We at coast elements of the Division continued patrolling until relieved by elements of the 305th Inf., and preparations were made for novement of the balance of the Division from the W soast to their new staging area. Patrols of the 128th Inf. following a report of Japa near CONSURGRA investigated and found only several dead bedies. The 127th Inf and the 126th Inf continued patrol operations. Artillery adjustment fire was conducted by one battery only. Five enemy were killed during the period and one taken prisoner. We suffered no casualties. To date, enemy dead number 6699, with 46 PMs. Our casualties total 450 KIA, 1890 WIA and 58 MIA. The enemy has paid 16.8 dead for each of our men killed in action.

In the USAF Cometery, LINCE, 54 interments were made. A total to date of 127 from this Division and attached units. Six interments were made in the USAF Cometery, Carigara. A total of 57 from this Division and attached units.

Thirteen officers and 231 EM replacements were received.

Morale was generally excellent. Fresh turkey, beef and breed were icsued. Arrangements for beer ration and PI supplies were made for the troops upon their return from the front. 126 pouches of 1st Class mail and 1250 bags of other mail were reserved.

Awards of 2 Silver Stars, 12 Bronse Star medals and 2 Oak Leaf Clusters to Bronze Star were announced.

A daily average of 477 divilions were employed for the 8 day period.
